

FLOWER DESIGN SCHEDULE FOR OCTOBER

- Year Theme: America's Melting Pot
October Theme: Europe
Tea/Luncheon Table Design: Marilyn Zaret
Eligible for: **The Kay MacLane Van Deusen Rose Award.** See page 31 in your yearbook. Designer's choice of plant material.
- Provisional: American Traditional Mass Design, see *Handbook*, pp. 70-71. Allotted space 14" wide x 12" deep. Staged on kitchen shelf 43" from floor.
- Novice: Traditional Mass Design in the European style, see *Handbook*, pp. 69-71. Allotted space 24" wide x 24" deep. Staged on a table 30" from the floor. Optional underlay to be provided by Designer.
- Intermediate: Traditional Mass Design in the European style, see *Handbook*, pp. 69-70. Allotted space 24" wide x 24" deep. Staged on a table 30" from the floor. Underlay required, to be provided by Designer.
- Advanced: A Design, Freedom of Style staged on a table on a stage 42" from the floor. Underlay required, to be provided by Designer.
- Advanced Plus: A Design, Freedom of Style using a 42" tall round black pedestal with a 15" round black top provided by the committee. Top may be covered.
- Trial Run: Open to all classes, critiqued only. May be point scored on request if design has been specified. Limit one entry per Designer.
- Invitational: Cascade Design by: Brenda Bingham

HORTICULTURE SCHEDULE FOR OCTOBER

- Year Theme: "America's Melting Pot", Europe
This year, if you can discover the origins of your specimen(s) you will be rewarded with additional points.
Phone, email, or text Jacklyn Kling by 9 p.m. OCTOBER 15, to pre-register entries. Entries can be delivered to the Garden Club Room on SUNDAY, OCTOBER 15, between 1 and 3 pm or between 8 and 9 am on MONDAY, OCTOBER 16. Entries must be cleaned, conditioned, and identified by *genus* and *species*, *variety* or *cultivar*, and *common name*. Total 4 identifiers plus origin if known.
- Class 1. Annuals-1 stem for a large specimen; 3 stems for small
Class 2. Perennials-1 stem for a large specimen; 3 stems for small
Class 3. Ornamental Grass Not to exceed 30" in length
Class 4. Bulbs, corms, and tubers
Class 5. Roses—1 stem or progression of blooms
Class 6. Vegetables
Class 7. Autumn foliage Not to exceed 30" in length
Class 8. Herbs
Class 9. Any other worthy specimen May be container grown, pot not to exceed 6 inches in diameter
